Note to SAS Officers:

Where there are a number of different risks involved in the same activity use the colour coded risks below to show the rating for each risk. The YFYFC interpretation of these ratings is to not worry about low risk ratings, try to use control measures to reduce risk in the Medium Risk ratings and do not allow anything with a high risk rating.

Comments/ Considerations, reasons for unacceptable risk. Changes to control measures implemented or required to reduce risk to an acceptable level. N.B. The sentence number corresponds to the hazard number given above.

1: Remove anything that could cause a slip trip or fall, warn people about known dangerous areas. Ensure all entrances and exits are kept clear.

2: Observe the animals to be judged noting any that appear to be a danger to competitors. In the case of such an observation, use best judgement to reduce risks, e.g. verbal warnings, or preventing people touching going near or even in a pen with animal. Ensure all competitors behave responsibly when in pen with stock. If not and are pre-empting a hazard warn or disqualify.

Ensure there are adequate access routes from the pen.

All non competitors (except for the livestock owner/farmer) should not be allowed near the stock.

3. Competitors and judges to have hand gel made available to use.
