General Rules

**Under 18s will need a signed parental consent form.
18s and over will need a second form of ID.**

1 AGE

Junior	Competitors to be aged 16 or under on 1 st September 2021 born on or after 1 September 2004
Intermediate	Competitors to be aged 21 or under on 1 st September 2021 born on or after 1 September 1999
Senior	Competitors to be aged 28 or under on 1 st September 2021 born on or after 1 September 1993

OPEN/SENIOR COMPETITIONS

Both these competitions can be entered by anyone, unless a restriction is stated, however it is only the competitions classed as "senior" that will go towards the Senior Trophy.

2 ENTRIES

Unless otherwise stated competition entry is free. All deposits required are stated under the competition name, on certain competitions fines will be applicable if a competitor or team does not turn up. This will be stated along with the amount on the competition rules and entry form.

Members are allowed to move up age categories unless otherwise stated.

Members may enter more than one competition outside of Section 1, subject to the rules and **where the timetable** allows. The steward in charge of the competition **MUST** be notified if a competitor is running late.

NO NEW ENTRIES WILL BE ACCEPTED ON RALLY DAY.

3 SECTION ONE ENTRIES (Classes 1 to 19)

Club Secretaries to send entries direct to **DISTRICT SECRETARIES**

Representation: District entries to County

- 1-5 Competing Clubs three go forward
- 6 and over Competing Clubs four go forward (Cledales and Craven only)

STOCKJUDGING COMPETITIONS

A competitor may enter only one stock judging competition in this section. Substitution in the stock judging classes can only be made by informing County Office no later than **9am Monday 16th May 2022.**

COOKERY/FLORAL ART

Competitors may enter only one of these competitions as the timetable does not allow for entry in both.

4 SECTION TWO ENTRIES (Classes 20-44)

Club Secretaries to send entries direct to County Office. Two entries per club. All work must be done at the Rally Site unless otherwise stated. If Districts are holding Section Two at their District Rally please make members aware that they **DO NOT QUALIFY** to County Rally from the District Rally but **NEED TO ENTER, BEFORE THE DISTRICT RALLIES, DIRECTLY TO COUNTY.**

5 **SECTION THREE ENTRIES (Classes 45-70)**

Club Secretaries to send entries direct to County Office. Each club may enter each class twice only and each competitor may enter only once in each class. All work must be made specifically for the 2022 County Rally. **Exhibits MUST NOT be removed before 4.00pm on the day of the Rally.** If Districts are holding Section Three at their District Rally please make members aware that they DO NOT QUALIFY to County Rally from the District Rally but NEED TO ENTER, BEFORE THE DISTRICT RALLIES, DIRECTLY TO COUNTY. CHANGES CANNOT BE MADE TO ENTRY FORMS AFTER DISTRICT RALLIES – NAMES CAN BE SUBSTITUTED BUT ADDITIONAL ENTRIES WILL NOT BE ACCEPTED.

6 **NORTHERN AREA ELIMINATORS**

The first three placed competitors in the Northern Area Eliminator will be required to go forward to represent the County at the 2022 Northern Area Field Day to be held on Saturday 25th June 2022 at Darlington Farmers Auction Mart, Humbleton, Darlington, DL2 2XX hosted by Yorkshire Federation of Young Farmers' Clubs.

The following competitions will go through to the Field Day: Beef, Lamb, Sheep, Pig & Novelty Judging, Vintage Tractor and Trailer Handling, Land Rover and Trailer Handling, Junior Pedal Tractor Handling, Mini Digger Challenges, all Tug of War competitions, Farm Machinery Skills, Fence Erecting, Open Floral Art (Stage or Screen), Hand & Machine Sheep Shearing, Senior Boat Race, Junior Eating Challenge, Woodwork, Log Saw, Egg Throwing, Pasta Collage, Dream Club Programme, Carved Thermalite Block, Nail Bashing, Turf Cakes, Yorkshire Brack, Hand Raised Growler, Rhubarb Pie, Curd Tart, 4 uses of Wensleydale Cheese and Cube Exhibit.

7 **MALVERN AUTUMN SHOW (24th & 25th SEPTEMBER 2022)**

Competitors may not enter more than one competition held at the Malvern Show: Team Cookery, Junior, Intermediate and Senior Floral Arts.

8 **IFYFC COMPETITIONS WEEKEND (9th JULY & 10th JULY 2022)**

Fence Erecting, Farm Machinery Skills and Cube Display.

MENS, LADIES & JUNIOR TUG OF WAR FINALS (6th AUGUST 2022)

Held at the Tenbury Show, Worcestershire.

10 **MEMBERSHIP CARDS**

ALL COMPETITORS MUST BE MEMBERS OF IFYFC BEFORE THE ENTRY CLOSING DATES, NO CARDS WILL BE ISSUED AFTER THE 11TH APRIL 2022. NO REPLACEMENT CARDS WILL BE ISSUED AFTER THE 16TH MAY 2022. MEMBERS MUST BRING A VALID MEMBERSHIP CARD WITH PHOTOGRAPH AND SIGNED ON THE BACK TO THE COUNTY RALLY. ANYONE WHO DOES NOT SHOW THEIR MEMBERSHIP CARD WILL BE FINED £20 AND ISSUED WITH A WRISTBAND FOR THE DAY. ALL MEMBERS AGED 18+ MUST SUPPLY A 2ND FORM OF ID (Passport, Driving Licence, Birth Certificate). ALL MEMBERS UNDER 18, MUST HAVE A SIGNED PARENTAL CONSENT FORM TO BE ABLE TO COMPETE AS STATED BY IFYFC.

Cards must be signed on the reverse. Expiry date 31/08/2022.

If a membership card is checked and found to be invalid then the competitor will be disqualified from competing on the day.

11 **JUDGING - THE JUDGES AND STEWARDS DECISION IS FINAL.**

Presidents Choice Award Rules

The current County President will award their own award entitled "The President's Choice Award" to **any** entry in Section 3 which they believed stood out the most, displayed great workmanship and was in the spirit of Yorkshire Young Farmers.

The award can be presented to **any exhibit** in this section even if it has not been placed by the competition judge who was judging that class. The County Presidents allocation of winner, will be final and no arguments will be entered into. If appropriate, the exhibit will then be displayed at the Great Yorkshire Show in the Young Farmers Pavilion.

12 **VERBAL ABUSE**

Aggressive behaviour in any form from a competitor or a member of the public on behalf of a competitor to the Judge or Steward will result in that competitor being disqualified.

13 **POINTS**

Points will be awarded on the basis of:

1st	6 points	2nd	5 points	3rd	4 points
4th	3 points	5th	2 points	6th	1 point

In sections two and three 1 point will be given for every member who enters a competition and competes on the day or brings their exhibit – the exceptions to this is class 69 Cookery Display.

Points for Cookery Display are as follows: 6 marks will be awarded for the overall display and 6 marks for the best interpretation of each theme, 5 for the second etc, allowing a maximum of 36 points to be awarded.

WHERE A CLUB HAS TWO OR MORE ENTRIES IN ONE COMPETITION, ONLY THE HIGHEST SCORING ENTRY WILL COUNT TOWARDS TROPHIES.

PROCEDURES

Classes 1-12 and 26 - 31

Competitors will be required to judge and give reasons on 1 ring of 4 animals (subject to availability). (Class 2 = 6 animals) and Classes 10, 11 & 12 as breeding animals.

The animals will be designated A, B, X, Y. (Class 2 = A, B, C, X, Y, Z)

Competitors must provide and wear a white coat, which must be worn during the period of the competition.

Throughout the competition, competitors must not communicate directly or indirectly with any person other than Judges and Stewards under penalty of disqualification. Members of the public will not be allowed in the judging area.

Cards will be supplied to each competitor on which must be marked the order the competitor places the animals. Only the tear-off section of the card may be used for making notes. During the competition, no other papers or literature may be used.

Competitors will be allowed 15 minutes for inspection and handling of the stock and each competitor will be allowed up to 2 minutes for stating their reasons. Competitors exceeding this time limit will incur penalties at the rate of 2 marks for each 15 seconds or part thereof. The marks will be deducted from their total score.

1 JUNIOR (Shorthorns)

Competitors must be 16 years of age or under on 1st September 2021.

PROCEDURE

The competitor will be required to judge and place one ring of four dairy cattle.

The competitor will be required to judge, place and give **POSITIVE** reasons on a second ring of four dairy cattle (Shorthorns at County Rally).

Cattle will be judged primarily as dairy animals, having due regard to the type recognised by the respective Breed Societies.

The cattle will be designated A, B, X, Y and the two rings will operate simultaneously.

TIMING

Fifteen minutes will be allowed for stock inspection, handling and preparing reasons. Following the placing cards being marked, competitors will be called at random to state their reasons to the Judge. The competitor will be allowed up to two minutes to state his/her reasons. Competitors who exceed the time limit will incur penalties at a rate of two marks for each fifteen seconds or part thereof.

PROCEDURE

The competitor will be required to judge and place one ring of six dairy cattle.

The competitor will be required to judge, place and give **POSITIVE** reasons on a second ring of six dairy cattle (Shorthorns at County Rally).

Cattle will be judged primarily as dairy animals, having due regard to the type recognised by the respective Breed Societies.

The cattle will be designated A, B, C, X, Y, Z and the two rings will operate simultaneously.

TIMING

Fifteen minutes will be allowed for stock inspection, handling and preparing reasons. Following the placing cards being marked, competitors will be called at random to state their reasons to the Judge. The competitor will be allowed up to three minutes to state his/her reasons. Competitors who exceed the time limit will incur penalties at a rate of two marks for each fifteen seconds or part thereof.

PROCEDURE

The competitor will be required to assess four dairy cows (Shorthorns at County Rally) using the linear method of assessing characteristics. Competitors are also required to place these

cattle in order of merit as to their suitability for milk production and breeding herd replacements.

Competitors to give positive reasons to the Judges to justify their placings.

The cattle will be designated A, B, X, Y.

YFYFC are following the Holstein UK guidelines for Linear Assessment in this competition.

TIMING

Thirty minutes will be allowed for stock inspection/assessment, handling and preparing reasons.

Following the placing cards being marked, competitors will be called at random to state their reasons to the Judge. The competitor will be allowed up to two minutes to state his/her reasons.

Competitors who exceed the time limit will incur penalties at a rate of two marks for each fifteen seconds or part thereof.

The competitor must be 16 years of age or under on 1st September 2021.

Exhibit Title: "British TV Programme" An exhibit to depict a British TV Programme.

The maximum display area for each competitor **MUST NOT exceed 76cm wide x 60cm deep x optional height** (i.e. no limitations to height). Exhibits to be composed of natural plant material, with or without accessories.

Exhibit is to be viewed from the front. Competitors own backboard and base boards are allowed and must be provided by the competitor if required and must adhere to the size limitations. The reverse of these backboards **MUST** compliment the theme and be neat and tidy.

At County Rally, the exhibit will be displayed on a table with a white table covering.

14 INTERMEDIATE FLORAL ART (21 and Under) (NFYFC)

The competitor must be 21 years of age or under on 1st September 2021.

Exhibit Title: "My Favourite Musical" An exhibit to depict your Favourite Musical. The maximum display area for each competitor **MUST NOT exceed 76cm wide x 60cm deep x optional height** (i.e. no limitations to height). Exhibits to be composed of natural plant material, with or without accessories.

Exhibit is to be viewed from the front. Competitors own backboard and base boards are allowed and must be provided by the competitor if required and must adhere to the size limitations. The reverse of these backboards **MUST** compliment the theme and be neat and tidy.

At County Rally, the exhibit will be displayed on a table with a white table covering.

15 SENIOR FLORAL ART (28 and Under) (NFYFC)

The competitor must be 28 years of age or under on 1st September 2021.

Exhibit Title: "Chinese New Year" An exhibit to depict Chinese New Year. The maximum display area for each competitor **MUST NOT exceed 76cm wide x 60cm deep x optional height** (i.e. no limitations to height). Exhibits to be composed of natural plant material, with or without accessories.

Exhibit is to be viewed from the front. Competitors own backboard and base boards are allowed and must be provided by the competitor if required and must adhere to the size limitations. The reverse of these backboards **MUST** compliment the theme and be neat and tidy.

At County Rally, the exhibit will be displayed on a table with a white table covering.

PROCEDURES FOR ALL FLORAL ART CLASSES

AN EXHIBIT:

Is composed of natural plant material, with or without accessories, contained within a space as specified in a show schedule. Backgrounds, bases, containers, drapes, exhibit titles and mechanics may always be included in an exhibit, unless otherwise stated. More than one placement may always be included, unless otherwise stated. Plant Material must predominate in all Still Life exhibits

NATURAL PLANT MATERIAL

Natural plant material is any vegetable matter. It includes fresh, dried, garden, wild, or made-up plant material. It is acceptable to enhance plant material by the application of oil, milk, wax or other similar products.

ARTIFICIAL PLANT MATERIAL

Artificial plant material is realistic or fantasy plant-forms, made wholly or partly from non-plant material. This includes, clay, fabric, glass, metal, paper, plastic, plaster, polyester, ribbon, shells, silk, sugar, wax, etc. Which is used as a substitute for natural plant material in an exhibit. Artificial plant material **is not allowed** unless specifically included in a show schedule (see reasons for disqualification). Artificial plant material or artificial plant forms that are an integral part of a container, base, background or accessory are permitted.

Artificial grass turf must not be used for any purpose including bases.

AN ACCESSORY

Anything other than natural plant material in an exhibit, such as, feathers, shapes (spheres, cones), shells, stones, wax candles. Natural plant material which has been tooled or crafted to resemble non-plant forms, e.g. birds nest, corn dolly, wooden figurine. Accessories may be decorated in any way, but greater credit should be given for the use of natural plant material where appropriate.

The following are not accessories and may also be used unless prohibited by the show schedule: backgrounds, bases, containers holding plant material, drapes, exhibit titles and

mechanics. These may be decorated in any way, but greater credit should be given for use of natural plant material where appropriate.

DISPLAY

A worktable will be provided close to the display area – approximately half a trestle table to be allocated per competitor. Each exhibit will be displayed to their best advantage with the space allocation. All exhibits must be the unaided work of the competitors and must be assembled in the hall. During the period of the competition, competitors must not communicate directly or indirectly with any person other than Judges or Stewards, under penalty of instant disqualification. No other person, other than the competitors, will be allowed in the competing area. Competitors may use a battery-operated glue gun or any other form of adhesive. There will no mains power supply available. Any exhibit exceeding the maximum measurements will be disqualified. The measurement will be from the outside edges of the back board or base board (i.e. the thickness of the backboard will be included in the size restrictions). Any accessories or drapes used on the outside of the back board or base board will be included in the overall measurement of the exhibit and should be within the size restrictions. The external side of the back board will be taken into account for the attractiveness of the exhibit marks and so should be covered to compliment the overall exhibit. Exhibits must remain in position throughout the day of the competition. All exhibits and competitor's property will be at the risk of the competitor and YFYFC cannot accept liability for any loss or damage sustained – therefore, competitors are advised to use items of little established value.

REASONS FOR DISQUALIFICATION

Failure to comply with any specific requirements of a class as stated in a show schedule, i.e. the measurements or the components. (Just remember – it is better to aim to be 1xm or 1 inch smaller than the size allowed as the size sated is the MAXIMUM size).

Inclusion of artificial plant material (unless specifically allowed by a show schedule)

Inclusion of fresh plant material that does not have roots or the cut ends of stems in water or water-retaining material. Exceptions: Air Plants, Cacti, Fruits, Grass Turf, Lichen, Moss, Succulents, Vegetables and long-lasting plant material which will remain turgid for the duration of a show. (Definition of turgid – the state of firmness of plant tissue resulting from adequate moisture, causing the plant cells to be fully expanded).

TIMING

Allowance of **one hour to include final checks and measurement of the exhibit**. Before leaving the competing area, competitors will be given a further 5 minutes to clear and tidy the work site.

Competitors may unpack their equipment and plant material/flowers onto the worktable before the one-hour practical session commences.

If floral foam is to be used, this may be pre-soaked prior to the competition. New pieces of floral foam **MUST** be used on the day of the competition.

Competitors are able to construct and tape their foam (oasis) in position on a board/container/exhibit prior to the one-hour practical session if required. Competitors are able to set up their display bay before the one-hour practical session commences.

Competitors must wear white coats during the period of the competition.

SCALE OF MARKS

If a very high number of entries are received, on the day, YFYFC reserves the right to use the NFYFC 'Standards Judging' system i.e. exhibits will be in the Excellent, Proficient or Competent categories.

16 TEAM COOKERY (Theme: 2022 Platinum Jubilee Gala Dinner) (NFYFC)

See National Rules on www.nfyfc.org.uk

Teams to consist of three members, one must be 28 years of age or under, one must be 21 years of age or under and one must be 16 years of age or under, on 1 September 2021.

PROCEDURE

Each team will be required to prepare and display four courses for a Gala Dinner celebrating HRH Queen Elizabeth 2nd's Platinum Jubilee, courses should include local produce where possible.

Teams should promote produce local to them and evidence of locality should be included in the overall display.

The menu must include at least one sweet course and one savoury course. Each Course will be required to serve two people. A drink does not count as a course and will not be scored.

Teams must ensure each course involves a cooked element, prepared from raw ingredients, demonstrating cookery skills. (It is advised that the combination of smoked salmon and cream cheese is not included).

TEAM REQUIREMENTS

Work on two trestle tables. This includes an area to prepare and an area to cook with two (2) butane gas stoves (gas stoves provided by teams).

Have recipe details available throughout the practical session for judge's inspection.

During the period of the competition, competitors must not communicate directly or indirectly with any person other than Judges or Stewards. **No other person, other than their team members, will be allowed in the competing area.**

Teams will not have access to an electrical supply but will have access to water. Teams may not use liquid nitrogen.

TIMING

One hour to **include** preparation and tidying of the site. Competitors will be penalised at the rate of one mark per minute or part thereof over allotted time.

Teams will be allocated their workspace and display space. Display bays may be set up **before** the one-hour preparation and cooking time and teams may unpack their equipment and ingredients onto the worktable before the one-hour practical session. At the end of the one-hour preparation and cooking time, teams should have tidied the site leaving a clear (wiped) worktable with only the gas stoves on it – i.e. they should have packed away their equipment and wiped down the worktable. The gas stoves should be left on the worktable to cool before being packed away.

EQUIPMENT

Competing teams are required to provide:

All ingredients (these may be brought to the competition already weighed out and vegetables ready washed – **all other work must be executed on site in the practical session**).

Two (2) butane gas stoves (currently available from approx. £12.00 from camping and outdoor retailers/Argos/Amazon). The stoves must be like the images below and be fuelled by butane cartridges:



DISPLAYS

Competitors will be allowed a maximum display space of 90cm (width) X 60cm (depth) X height optional (i.e. no height limit) which to display the courses to their best advantage. Please note these are the EXTERNAL dimensions. If teams use back and/or side boards the whole of the board must be within the dimensions given. Any accessories or drapes used on the outside walls will be included in the overall size limit of the exhibit. **Displays which exceed the above dimensions will be disqualified.**

Teams must:

- Display a menu card.
- Display details of recipes.

There are no limitations on the contents of the display. Menu cards, recipes and display accessories (non food items) etc may be brought to the competition ready prepared.

Displays must remain in position throughout the day of the competition. All displays and competitor's property will be at the risk of the competitor and YFYFC cannot accept liability for any loss or damage sustained – therefore, competitors are advised to use items of little established value.

Competitors must wear white coats or equivalent and be thoroughly smart in their appearance. Competitors will be required to wear hairnets/ beard nets or hats.

Competitors to be 17 years of age and over on 1st September 2021.

Team of two (one male, one female) and 17 years and over. **Driving licences must be shown on the day or competitors will not be allowed to compete.**

One competitor is required to drive a Land Rover and cattle trailer around an obstacle course, and one competitor to reverse back along the same course. Engine to be switched off in-between. Anyone driving in an unsafe manner will be stopped/disqualified by the Steward. A team representative must report at the given time to be allocated a time to compete. One competitor is required to drive the tractor and trailer around an obstacle course, and one competitor to reverse back along the same course. Engine to be switched off in-between. Anyone driving in an unsafe manner will be stopped/disqualified by the Steward.

A team representative must report at the given time to be allocated a time to compete. Failure to report at the allocated time will result in disqualification.

Team consists of 1 Male and 1 Female member, both members must be over 18 only.

PROCEDURE

To saw through wooden log.

Competitors provide their own crosscut saw. Wooden logs will be provided.

TIMING - The fastest time wins.

SCALE OF MARKS

In the event of a tie, the quality of the sawn edge will be noted after each team has completed.

A team shall consist of three (3) members aged 28 years or under.

HEALTH & SAFETY – ESSENTIAL READING/ACTION FOR ALL COMPETITORS

It is essential that all competitors read the Health and Safety Executive's guidance paper concerning fencing and note is taken of the safe working practices and protective clothing equipment that is recommended. The Health and Safety Executive guidance paper 'Fencing' (AFAG104) can be downloaded from the NFYFC website.

PROCEDURE

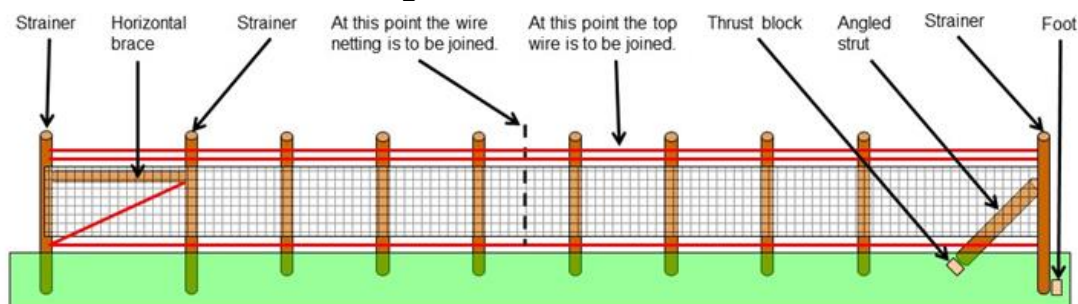
The team will be required to erect a 28m stock proof boundary fence in a straight line, using the materials provided (as illustrated in the diagram).

Total height to top of fence 45 inches.

Diagram is not to scale and is for illustrative purposes only

All spacings to be determined by the competitors

Drawing is NOT TO SCALE - refer to notes.



The posts shall be at a maximum of 4m centres, with intermediate posts at equal spacing. It shall be constructed of post and high tensile netting.

One strand of high tensile plain wire below the netting, 2" above ground level.

The netting shall be set 2" above the ground wire.

There shall be 2 strands of high tensile plain wire above the netting, set at 2" & 5" above the top of the netting – ie, 2" between the netting and lower wire, then 3" between the 2 wires.

Netting shall be secured to the end strainers using a recognised knot.

At one end of the fence there will be a box strainer assembly using a horizontal strut and diagonal brace wire.

The box strainer shall be made with 2 x 8' strainers and an 8' horizontal brace, with 2.5 HT plain wire.

The horizontal brace shall be morticed into the strainers on both ends.
At the other end, the fence will be secured with a strainer assembly.
The assembly shall be made using an 8' strainer and 8' angled strut, with the strut secured using a horizontal thrust block.
The thrust block shall be dug 8" below ground level and be left open for judges inspection.
A horizontal foot shall be used on the bottom of the strainer.
The strut is to be morticed into the strainer at 18" to the top of the strut – ie, between the 4th and 5th wire on the net.
A hand tied joint will be required in the netting and a hand tied joint in the top line wire; towards the centre of the fence (no joining aids will be permitted).

The team are required to **prepare a written risk assessment/method statement**, which is to be handed to the Chief Steward on the day of the competition - prior to the competition start. *Failure to provide a written risk assessment/method statement or failure to comply with it; or working unsafely, will result in immediate disqualification. Please see NFYFC Fence Erecting Risk Assessment Template below. This may be used and completed as teams wish (Risk 1 already entered as an example). Teams are welcome to complete their own risk assessment.*

Only materials supplied by the organisers are to be used (see list of materials below).
Only hand tools will be allowed and the teams themselves **must** provide these. **No power tools or chainsaws are allowed.**

All tools and equipment used must be fit for purpose and be in good condition, well maintained and safely operated by members of the team at all times. Judges/stewards have the right to stop the use of tool/piece of equipment if, in their view, it is not safe to use or is being handled/used in an unsafe manner.

Competitors are not allowed to shorten any of the vertical posts.

Water can be used during the competition if circumstances require.

The Judges reserve the right to inspect any strut following completion of the task.

All teams are required to dismantle their fence prior to the Presentation of Awards (The thrust plate and any blocks/cross members must be out of the ground). – Teams are required to clear away all debris and any off-cuts of wire etc must **not** be put down the postholes. Receptacles will be provided for this purpose. Soil will be available to make the ground good.

Any team not complying with this ruling will be disqualified and receive a £75 fine. The Judge's decision is final.

Competitors to be 28 years of age or under on 1st September 2021.

A team shall consist of four members all of whom must be 28 years of age or under on 1st September 2021. For this competition members will be working as individuals on tasks 1-3 and as a team on tasks 4. At the National Final only – Task 5 Hazard Perception.

CERTIFICATES/LICENCES REQUIRED

Task 1: Tractor and Manure Spreader:

Competitor requires a UK driving licence with F entitlement. This must be produced on the day of the competition in order to participate in this task. (The F entitlement can be gained at 16; but is automatically entitled with passing the car driving test).

Task 2: Tractor:

Competitor requires a UK driving licence with F entitlement. This must be produced on the day of the competition in order to participate in this task. (The F entitlement can be gained at 16; but is automatically entitled with passing the car driving test).

Task 3: ATV Handling:

Adequate training must have been completed by the competitor who will carry out the ATV task. At the NFYFC final a certificate of competence to show 'adequate training' in ATV Handling must be produced. A copy of the certificate must be handed to the judges on the day of the competition.

A Certificate of Competence for ATV's, issued by City & Guilds NPTC is more than acceptable evidence of 'adequate training'. The appropriate City & Guilds NPTC qualification is known as the Level 2 Certificate in the Safe Use of All-terrain Vehicles (0014-32). However, a certificate issued by another training provider (e.g. Lantra) will also be accepted. The most basic level of certificate which will be accepted is called an EASI (European All-Terrain Vehicle Safety Institute) certificate; available from most reputable ATV dealers. The EASI certificate is very much a dealer short induction course - a basic operators course designed to familiarise the operator with all the controls and operating procedures, which includes elements of safety. Whilst it ticks the box of 'adequate training', it should not be viewed as a replacement for a City & Guilds type course.

[Under the Provision and Use of Work Equipment Regulations 1998 (PUWER) there is a legal requirement that "adequate training", including the use of any towed equipment or attachments, be undertaken by those riding ATV's. The Health and Safety Executive (HSE) regards training provided by recognised training providers as "adequate" for the purposes of PUWER].

Task 4: First Aid:

The team member in control of the first aid task must hold a current first aid certificate of either the British Red Cross, St John Ambulance, or an alternative nationally recognised body. The certificate must be no more than three years old. A copy of the certificate must be handed to the competition judges on the day of each round of the competition.

Prior to the auction commencing the competitor will view a total of 6 items. Lots will include agricultural and non-agricultural items.

The Competitor will then have **20 minutes** to draft a handwritten, catalogue-style description and provide a valuation figure for each item on the day of the competition.

The competitor is to hand their descriptions and valuations to the judge prior to the auction. The competitor will then choose 3 items at random 'out of a hat' from the 6 available, to auction.

The judge will identify one of the lots to have a reserve. The item and price of the reserve lot is at the judge's discretion.

The competitor should provide an introduction and then open the auction sale, outlining the procedure and relevant conditions of the sale e.g. the payment process, order of the auction, buyer's commission rate.

Competitors at County Rally will not be eligible to watch other competitors until after they have competed.

Stewards will be placed in the audience to act as purchasers on the lots to ensure there is enough bidding to enable the competitor to demonstrate the skill. These stewards will be anonymous to the competitor and will only bid if no other bids are forthcoming.

Stewards will have no knowledge of the item's values provided by the competitor.

Once all the lots have been 'sold' the auctioneer will close the auction in a suitable way and the judge will work out their score.

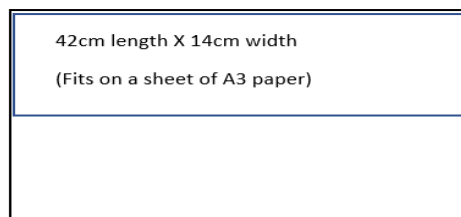

The competitor will be required to design a banner to promote British agricultural produce. The design must be scaled to fit inside a box 42cm X 14cm.



This competition will be judged prior to the Great Yorkshire Show and the three best entries will be made into a banner 6ft wide x 2ft tall and these will be displayed at the show. The YFC Logo must be included, banner designs can be hand drawn or on the computer.

The name and club of the competitor **MUST** be written on the back of the exhibit.

68 OPEN TWO MINUTE VIDEO PROMOTING BRITISH PRODUCE (GYS)

Competitors must be 28 years of age or under on 1st September 2021.

To comply to child performance licencing we request only members aged over 18 have their faces appear in the video however the voices of members of all ages can be used.

All members aged under 18 must have signed photographic consent from that may be requested to enable YFYFC to use in any promotional campaigns.

PROCEDURE

Competitors are to produce a video to promote British produce in the form of a TV advert. Anyone appearing in the video must be a member. Videos are to be saved onto a USB stick that can be plugged into a laptop and watched by the judge.

The video is to be a **maximum** of two minutes long.

The name of the competing club **MUST** be displayed on the USB stick.

GYS – Please note Competitions 66 – 68 will be removed from County Rally by a member of the GYS Committee and will be taken to the Great Yorkshire Show where they will be displayed and judged. The two minute video will become the artistic property of YFYFC and used to promote the Federation on social media and any event deemed appropriate.

69 COOKERY DISPLAY – THE BIG LUNCH CELEBRATING THE QUEEN’S PLATINUM JUBILEE – DRINK, SAVOURY, SANDWICH, DESSERT AND FAVOUR

Competitors must be 28 years of age or under on 1st September 2021.

PROCEDURE

A display to champion British produce for the “**Big Lunch**” with the **theme “Queen’s Platinum Jubilee”**.

The 5 items must be clearly marked 1-5.

Maximum size 1m x 1m x 1m. Recipe cards to be displayed.

Any exhibit exceeding the maximum measurements will be disqualified.

70 NFYFC CUBE EXHIBIT – MUSICALS (NFYFC)

Competitors to be 28 years of age or under on 1st September 2021.

PROCEDURE

A maximum of five (5) members of the Club will stage the exhibit on the day of the competition on behalf of the whole club.

THEME “Musicals” – one element (out of elements 3-5) to be up-cycled (before and after photograph is required). This theme can be interpreted in any way that the club sees fit.

The Club Team is required to exhibit 5 crafts. 1 craft from each of the headings below:

Craft 1 - Floral Art (Any item using cut flowers and accessories in a suitable container).

Craft 2 – Cookery/Baking (This craft will be tasted so must be covered with cling film).

Craft 3 – Textile Handicraft (must include British Wool) (Knitwear, Tailored, Crochet for example) .

Craft 4 – Natural Handicraft (Any item using wood, metal, clay, glass, stone or shell for example).

Craft 5 – Art (An item that could include photography, a graphic or a picture in any medium).

The five crafts need to be clearly marked 1-5 together with the heading the craft comes under.

For example

- 1- Floral Art
- 2- Cookery
- 3- Sewn Handicraft
- 4- Natural Handicraft
- 5- Art Handicraft

Each Exhibit to have a MAXIMUM WIDTH of 1 metre at any given point and a MAXIMUM DEPTH of 1 metre and MAXIMUM HEIGHT of 1 metre.

Any exhibit exceeding the maximum measurements will be disqualified.

The measurement will be from the outside edges of the external walls of the exhibit. (i.e. Make your exhibit slightly smaller than the maximum dimensions). Any accessories or drapes used on the outside of the external walls of the cube will be included in the overall measurement of the exhibit. The external walls will be taken into account for the attractiveness of the exhibit marks and so should be covered to compliment the overall exhibit. The exhibit must have 3 walls.

Useful Rally Tips

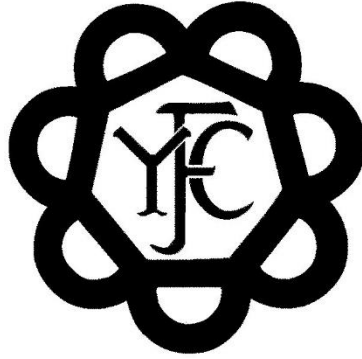
- Section 1 competitions – qualify from your District Rally.
- Section 2 and 3 competitions – are direct entry from your club.
- Members can only participate in one Section 1 judging competition.

- Read the rules!
- Check the size allowance of exhibits or risk being disqualified.

On the day:

- Remember your membership card, parental consent form or second form of ID
- Your exhibits!
- Certificates if you are entering farm machinery skills and Blue Seal certificate if you are entering sheep shearing classes.
- White coats for stock judging, floral art and cookery.
- Any tools or equipment you may need to compete.
- Check the timetable – don't be late!
- Spare clothes – YFYFC competitions can involve getting wet.
- Cash for purchasing refreshments from the Café.
